Re: Tree boxes in the 100 block of 15th Street, NE

At our regularly scheduled public meeting on June 8, 2006, our Commission voted unanimously to request a change in the configuration of tree boxes along the 100 block of 15th St NE. We request that the new configuration be a continuous planting strip to run the length of the block. The current configuration is a series of small individual trees boxes alternating with expanses of concrete side walk. We ask this be done in conjunction with the planned 2006 sidewalk rehabilitation project on 15th Street, NE between East Capitol Street and Constitution Avenue.

On May 19, 2006, Commissioner Nicholas Alberti and residents of 15th Street, NE met with District Department of Transportation representatives Mr. Adullahi Mohamed and Mr. Christopher Delfs to discuss this matter. Mr. Mohamed advised us that a change in the configuration was possible if that change was agreeable to residents of the 100 block of 15th Street, NE. Residents of all address on that block have received notification and a majority has indicated their agreement with the change as documented in the attached survey results.

The residents of the 100 block of 15th St. NE in ANC 6A single member district 04 in PSA 103 responded to a survey on Sunday May 14 and on Tuesday May 16, 2006. On May 16, a letter was left at those houses on the block where no response was received after in-person two attempts for administration of the survey. The letter provided the deadline of Friday, May 19 for a response to the survey.


The purpose of the survey was to gauge interest in the creation of a continuous grassy knoll connecting existing and planned tree boxes and broken up, as appropriate, by existing and planned trees, and small concrete steps in front of residents' doors, between the sidewalk and the street, to access the street. During administration of the survey, residents were advised that the city will landscape initially by planting grass; however, residents are responsible for maintenance (cutting the grass, replacing with other types of shrubs or flowers, fertilizing and watering, etc). The survey was administered by administered by Ajit Joshi of 111 15th St NE and Heidi Elliott of 109 15th St. NE.

Sixteen (16) responses were received. Fifteen (15) responses were in favor of the creation of the grassy knoll. One (1) response was not in favor of the creation of the grassy knoll.

Based on this survey, a majority of respondents, based on one response per household from the owner of the house, are in favor of the creation of a continuous grassy knoll among tree boxes on the this block, broken up, as appropriate, by trees and small concrete steps in front of doors to access the street.

SURVEY for 100 Block of 15th St NE

The DC Government Department of Transportation (DDOT) plan to repair the sidewalk of the 100 Block of 15th St NE has two options: to add a tree box where required (e.g. in front of 107 15th St NE) or to create a continuous grassy knoll connecting all tree boxes. This knoll will look like other similarly landscaped areas on the 1400 and 1500 blocks of A Street NE, the 1400 block of Ames Place NE, the 1500 block of Constitution NE, and the west side of the unit block of 15th St NE (next to Car Barn). Continuity in the knoll may be broken up by existing trees or a small concrete walkway in front of residents' doors, between the sidewalk and the street. While the city will landscape initially by planting grass, residents are responsible for maintenance (cutting the grass, replacing with other types of shrubs or flowers, fertilizing and watering, etc).

A majority of residents (i.e. 50% or greater) is required based on one response per household from the owner of the house, or proxy to those renting the house by email or by telephone providing such proxy, to create a continuous grassy knoll among tree boxes on the this block, broken up, as appropriate, by trees and small concrete steps in front of doors to access the street.

This survey is administered by two neighbors: Ajit Joshi of 111 15th St NE and Heidi Elliott of 109 15th St. NE.
