SPECIAL MEETING

Under the authority of the ANC 6A bylaws, Article 5 Section 5, there will be a Special Meeting of ANC 6A on Thursday, September 1 at 7:00 pm at Sherwood Recreation Center, 10th and G NE.

The Special Meeting will discuss potential alternatives to the redistricting proposal drafted by the Ward 6 Redistricting Task Force appointed by Councilmember Tommy Wells. The only other business will be to consider and vote on protests of the licenses for Dangerously Delicious Pies and for Khans Barbeque, if still necessary. The meeting is necessary because there will be insufficient time for a full airing of issues related to the potential size and shape of the ANC at the September 8 regular meeting. The meeting will be as brief as possible and as long as necessary for everyone to have a reasonably indepth discussion. We need to understand the Task Force recommendations and possible alternatives. Cody Rice, a member of the Task Force, will be available to explain the thinking behind the recommendations, and help us with the implications and how-tos of alternatives.

Council Chair Kwame Brown has committed to attend our September 8 meeting, and his presentation and our questions to him will consume a substantial large part of the meeting. With our regular ANC business and the discussion of, and votes on, the Task Force recommendations, the meeting would run substantially past 9 or 10 pm.

The authority to call the Special Meeting follows:

Article V, Section 5. Special meetings of the Commission can be called by the Chair or by written request of three Commissioners. The purpose of the special meeting shall be stated in the notice and no other topic may be discussed at that meeting, except by unanimous consent at the beginning of the meeting. At least seven days notice will be given to each Commissioner. Accordingly, notice shall also be given to the public by the Secretary as outlined in Article V, Section 4.
