Seasonal Illuminations

"Seasons Greenings" at the U.S. Botanic Garden began November 24 and will continue through January 2, 10 a.m.- 5 p.m. This is a delightful venue, particularly on cold, dreary days, but it really shines through the winter holidays. This year, their famous Garden Railway in the East Gallery will feature imaginative buildings created with plant materials. Explore "Who Lives Here?" and see all kinds of delightful dwellings, from an opossum house and a critter condo to model American presidential homes. Don't miss this popular exhibit, including one of the largest indoor decorated trees in Washington DC and the capital's landmark buildings in the Garden Court.

See Union Station's Holiday Model Train as it winds its way through the mountains and fjords of Norway. Join the Marines, Mayor, city officials, and the Ambassador of Norway as they jumpstart the train and light the enormous Christmas tree December 1 at 6 p.m. This display will be on view through January 3 and is particularly suitable for children.

The U.S. Capitol Christmas tree (on the west lawn) is considered by many to be the most beautiful Christmas tree in the city – and it's right in our own back yard. The illumination ceremony will be held Tuesday, December 6 from 5-5:30 p.m.

A National Menorah is lit on the White House grounds at the Ellipse during the eight nights of Hanukkah, beginning Tuesday, December 20 at 4 p.m.

Streetcar Forum

From David Holmes, Chair, ANC 6A Mayor Vincent Gray and Transportation Director Terry Bellamy will join ANC 6A, ANC 6C, ANC Single Member District 7D01, and the Sierra Club to address the remaining steps necessary to complete the streetcar line. This is the latest in a series of briefings for those interested in the H Street/Benning Road streetcar line. Mayor Gray and Director Bellamy will answer questions on December 6 at 7 p.m. in the Atlas Theater, 1333 H Street, NE. Questions likely to be asked:

What decisions are being made about the terminus points for the H Street/Benning line? Are there any concrete plans to present?

What routes might bring the streetcar to the Metro station on the west end?

How is public input being sought for routes to and beyond the currently planned western and eastern terminus?

Have there been recent contacts with Amtrak? Is there a possibility of using a pass-though under the Hopscotch Bridge for the streetcar line and/or a maintenance facility? Is Amtrak open to use of the pedestrian tunnel to the Union Station Metro Station?
