Calling All Call Boxes

Paul Williams of the DC Heritage Tourism Coalition will be the speaker at the June 6th NLPNA meeting. Paul will be talking about a new, fun and exciting project to transform obsolete call boxes throughout the city. Call boxes are cast-iron boxes that were once used to summon the police and fire departments in the days before 911. The call boxes were going to be ripped out by the Department of Public Works, but because of the efforts of Paul Williams and others, the city is not going to remove the call boxes. Instead, neighborhood groups will now be able to apply for a grant of \$500 per call box to transform the call box.

Creativity is being encouraged. Artists could decorate the call boxes. Historians could use the call box to display something about the neighborhood's past such as a quotation or an old photograph. The possibilities are endless.

Nancy Metzker, with the Capitol Hill Restoration Society, is coordinating the call box effort on Capitol Hill. A survey has been done, and there are approximately 75 call boxes remaining in the Capitol Hill area. Within the NLPNA boundaries, there are at least five call boxes (11th & C, 13th & D, 13th & Maryland, and two at 13th & Constitution).
