The next presentation will be Wednesday, March 16, 6:30-7:15 p.m. at Ebenezer's Coffee House, 2nd and F St. NE. The topic will be "Roofs 102" with David Lindeman from L&M Contracting. This is a followup to his presentation on the relatively flat, low-sloped roofs on a lot of Hill houses. In "Roofs 102" he'll talk about the care and maintenance of other kinds of roofs found on the Hill like pitched, mansards, etc., and embellishments like turrets that intersect with roofs.
