Buy a House for \$250?! by Sharon Cochran

On August 7th, at least two houses in our neighborhood will be sold by lottery for \$250. Houses at 1372 E Street N.E. and 1345 Emerald Street are among the 34 houses to be offered through the District of Columbia's Homestead Program. Usually, the houses offered in this program need a lot work to bring them up to the city housing code. Any city resident who has never owned a home and has a good enough credit rating to qualify for loans to repair the house is eligible for the lottery. A winner and two runners-up are chosen for each house. Last year, several houses in our neighborhood were sold in a very successful lottery that drew over 3,000 qualified applicants. Repairs have started on most of the houses, and some may be occupied this summer. On May 18th, application packages can be picked up at the University Legal Services office, 300 Eye Street N.E. #202, and other offices in the city. For a complete list of properties, watch for ads in local papers or check the April 20th District Weekly section of the Washington Post. Control Board must now approve the sales.
