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Sasha Bruce House Reopened

The Sasha Bruce Independent Living Program at 1312 East Capitol Street N.E. has been reopened after extensive renovations, with the first two young adults arriving on October 3. The program coordinators plan to have all eight residential slots filled by mid-November.

According to Debby Shore, Executive Director of Sasha Bruce Youthwork, Inc., Sasha Bruce hopes to be able to host an open house sometime late this year or early next year. In the meantime, neighbors are welcome to call the facility to arrange a tour of the newly renovated facility. As it is a residential facility, the staff needs to work visits into the house schedule – if you're interested, call the staff at 202/675-9375. Ms. Shore can be reached at 202/675-9340.

Though the facility has a certificate of occupancy for eight residents, Sasha Bruce plans to apply to add an additional seven slots, bringing the total number up to 15. There is no timetable for this application, which would be subject to public hearings and approval.

The Sasha Bruce Building

The following history of the Sasha Bruce House building is excerpted from Scott, Pamela and Lee, Antoinette J. *Buildings of the District of Columbia*, Oxford University Press 1993, p. 258.

Bartholomew Daly House, 1908 Clement A. Didden and Son. 1312 East Capitol St, NE

August Getz and Son were the builders of this unusual Neoclassical house erected for \$8,995. The two-story Ionic portico of the Daly house breaks the area's typical row house streetscape, with the façade partially shaded by it and the attic dormers shaded by the tall balustrade. Yellow brick and a red tile roof add to the house's Mediterranean flavor, an early twentieth-century version of a rural or suburban temple house updated for an urban context.

ANC Subcommittee Approves Lovejoy School Extension

The ANC's zoning and planning subcommittee met on Oct. 10 to consider the Lovejoy School extension, which includes 12 additional units on the north side with underground parking. Winter Properties, the developer, presented their design proposal to the subcommittee.

Winter also suggested a partnership with the neighborhood to develop the park at the north end of the lot, pledging to contribute \$20,000 towards the park if the neighborhood contributes \$10,000 and establishes a 501(c)(3). The subcommittee then voiced concerns some residents expressed.

After considering the developer's responses, and the overwhelming neighborhood support for the project, the subcommittee voted in favor of the extension.
