Dear Council Members:

At the June 9, 2005, regularly scheduled Commission meeting, and with a quorum of 7 of 8 commissioners present, the Commission voted to support and endorse the *Dog Park Establishment Amendment Act of 2005*, bill number B16-0028, introduced in the District of Columbia City Council by Councilman Graham on January 18, 2005. This legislation will authorize the establishment of designated dog parks on District of Columbia Department of Parks and Recreation parkland and allow for the Mayor to promulgate rules to implement dog park operations. The proposed bill is attached.

The Commission considered comments from residents regarding the benefits of designated offleash areas for dogs, dog owners and the general public in our support of this legislation. Some of the benefits, which were included in this discussion, include that dogs allowed to exercise offleash are happier and healthier, and are less likely to create a nuisance, develop anti-social or aggressive behavior problems, bark excessively, or destroy property. Further, the benefits to the community included making the surrounding area safer; providing a social hub and heightened sense of connectedness and community; and reducing the need for and cost of enforcement.

The Commission urges Councilwoman Ambrose and the District of Columbia Council to enact the *Dog Park Establishment Amendment Act of 2005*. Moreover, we recommend that during the promulgation of rules, as well as the designation of each dog park, include a rigorous public comment requirement and that respective Advisory Neighborhood Commission be given great weight in such deliberations.

Sec. 2. The Animal Control Act of 1979, effective October 18, 1979 (D.C. Law 3-30;	15

(1) Add a new paragraph (3A) to read as follows:	18
"(3A) The term "dog park" means an officially established off-leash dog exercise	19
