Mr. Maloney,

At our October 11, 2007, our Commission, at a regularly scheduled meeting and with a quorum present, voted to request that the Historic Preservation Review Board (HPRB) postpone - for one month - the Board's consideration of the following addresses located in ANC 6A: (1) 1137 C Street NE, (2) 217 8<sup>th</sup> Street NE, 1131 D Street NE and (3) 716 9<sup>th</sup> Street NE.

Section 13(a)-(c) of the Advisory Neighborhood Commissions Act of 1975, effective October 10, 1975, D.C. Law 1-21, as amended by the Comprehensive Advisory Neighborhood Commission Reform Amendment Act of 2000, effective June 27, 2000, D.C. Law 13-135, D.C. Official Code Section 1-309.10(a)-(c)(collectively, the ANC Act) sets forth the types of actual or proposed government actions for which ANCs are to receive thirty (30) days advance written notice. This includes:

(a) Each Advisory Neighborhood Commission may advise the Council of the District of Columbia, the Mayor and each executive agency, and all independent agencies, boards and commission of the government of the District of Columbia with respect to all proposed matters of the District government policy including, but not limited to, decision regarding planning, streets, recreation, social services, programs, education, health, safety, budget, and sanitation which affect the Commission Area.


