Advisory Neighborhood Commission (ANC) 6A Minutes Zoom Meeting December 11, 2025

Present: Commissioners Dave Wethington, Jeff Giertz, Stephen Kolb, Amber Gove, and Roberta Shapiro were present. Commissioner Paul Spires was present but did not vote throughout the meeting.

The meeting convened virtually via Zoom at 7:00 pm.

Commissioner Dave Wethington called the meeting to order and noted the presence of a quorum. The minutes for the ANC November 2025 meeting were accepted subject to any minor or technical corrections approved by the Secretary. The agenda for the December 2025 meeting as amended was accepted by unanimous consent.

The community received meeting notice via listservs, the Hill Rag, ANC 6A website, X, and Facebook.

Community Presentation: Mr. Robert Hoyle, New Site Manager for Sherwood Recreation Center
New site manager of Sherwood Recreation Center Mr. Robert Hoyle introduced himself, noting that he has served at various recreation centers in DC for eight years. Mr. Hoyle is aware that Sherwood needs improvement and reported that 95% of equipment in the fitness room has been replaced or repaired. As of December 1, 2025, there is a new program for young children from 3:30-6:00 pm Mondays through Fridays; the Tiny Tots program is being revamped. Programming for seniors is also in the works. Mr. Hoyle encourages neighbors to take advantage of all DPR services, even those outside of Sherwood. There are several outstanding work orders, including finishing stairwell painting and installing basketball court lights. Mr. Hoyle will place an order for wipes for the fitness room equipment.

The December 2025 Treasurer's report submitted by Commissioner Roberta Shapiro reviewed the expenditures accrued in November: \$275 for September and November notetaking and \$846.19 and \$846.20 for September and October administrative services. After these distributions totaling \$2,242.39, the closing uncommitted funds available at the end of November as reported by OANC were \$28,161, down from the opening balance of \$30,403.39. The savings account has a balance of \$100.05. Commissioner Shapiro moved and Commissioner Stephen Kolb seconded the motion that ANC 6A approve the Treasurer's report as presented. The motion passed 5-0.
2. Commissioner Shapiro noted that it is time to pay the budgeted expense of \$3,172.50 for 12 monthly meeting announcement ads in the Hill Rag and one ad in the annual Fagan Guide. The Commission reaffirmed the importance of supporting local media.

New Business:

1. Commissioner Wethington moved and Commissioner Jeff Giertz seconded the motion that ANC 6A authorize Commissioners Wethington, Gove, and Giertz to finalize its Annual Report for Fiscal Year 2025. The motion passed 5-0.
2. Commissioner Shapiro moved and Commissioner Kolb seconded the motion that ANC 6A approve the testimony that was presented to the DC Council Committee on Facilities on December 3, 2025 regarding Bill 26-113 "Department of Parks and Recreation Hours Expansion Amendment Act of 2025" and other issues related to the Sherwood Recreation Center. The written testimony is to be submitted to the Council by the ANC prior to December 17, 2025. The testimony included the need for extended hours and more maintenance and programming; there was overall a lot of scrutiny of DPR. The motion passed 5-0.
3. TPS Committee Chair Patrick Bloomstine recommended and Commissioner Shapiro seconded the motion that ANC 6A authorize 6A04 Commissioner Gove and/or Patrick Bloomstine, Chair of the ANC 6A Transportation and Public Space Committee, to testify at the DC Council

- Committee on the Environment and Transportation hearing concerning transportation to the RFK site redevelopment. This coincides with much of the work the Committee has been involved in, including bike lanes and Streetcar replacement options. The motion passed 5-0.
4. Commissioner Wethington moved and Commissioner Shapiro seconded the motion that ANC 6A approve Rachael Loper as a member of the Economic Development and Zoning (EDZ) Committee. The motion passed 5-0.
 5. Commissioner Wethington moved and Commissioner Giertz seconded the motion that ANC 6A change its' January 2026 meeting date from January 8, 2026 (2nd Thursday) to January 15, 2026 (3rd Thursday). The motion passed 5-0.

Single Member District reports

Commissioner Shapiro (6A03) has spent a lot of time inventorying areas of improvement at Sherwood and had a community cleanup in November 2025. There is an ABCA issue raised by another ANC and the Commissioner is working to get clarity on this. The buildings at 1000-1014 H Street continue to be vacant, boarded up and graffitied. DOB has an exception to the vacant/blighted tax status as the buildings are for sale but that is expiring and there is an inspection scheduled for December. There are apparently building plans filed not shared with the ANC, and the Commissioner is seeking an update on the situation.

Commissioner Amber Gove (6A04) noted that any residents interested in the Ward 6 Strategic bike Plan should submit comments online. There were many overflowing public litter cans in the neighborhood last weekend; DPW response has been lacking and the neighbors should continue documenting this issue. The Commissioner attended the Brickie Awards and appreciates all the work that went into the evening. Eastern High School won the DC State SAA Class AA Championship and there will be a holiday bike ride this Saturday starting at Watkins Elementary and ending at the Roost for free hot chocolate.

Commissioner Jeff Giertz (6A06) noticed an abundance of beautiful holiday lights in the neighborhood. The Commissioner reminds residents that DC requires residents to shovel their sidewalks, and volunteers can sign up to shovel neighbors' sidewalks or informally help as well.

Commissioner Kolb (6A07) is finding a solution for a neighbor who has a seemingly vacant neighboring property; the Commissioner is working with the Department of Buildings (DOB) and will reach out to MPD.

Commissioner Wethington (6A05) encourages people to come hear DC Water on Monday about the Color the Curb issue. There is still work happening at Kingsman Dog Park. The Commissioner will likely be relocating at the end of January and will continue service to this ANC as long as possible, but January will probably be his last meeting.

Community Comment

Ms. Jen DeMayo from Councilmember Allen's office shared the success of the 19th annual Brickie awards. Councilmember Allen's emergency Streateries bill passed, making it less expensive and restrictive to operate a "streatery". The Council also extended juvenile curfews with limits. There was a hearing on expanding recreation center hours and opening more DCPS fields for

youth sports. Tomorrow morning will be Councilmember Allen's last office hours of the year at Tango Pastry between 8:30-10:00 am.

MOCR Noah Glasgow shared two updates: Mayor Bowser's last day in office will be January 2, 2027 and the Mayor and State Superintendent of Education are hosting the second weekend of EdFest for pre-k through 8th graders. This is DC's annual public school fair where community members can hear from all of DC's public and public charter schools. It will be at 415 Rhode Island Avenue NE from 10:00 am - 2:00 pm on Saturday. Anyone interested can also register at www.Myschooldc.org. The 2024-2025 DC School Report Card was released and found that the 24/25 school year had the highest reported graduation rate ever in DC at 78.7%, an 18% jump from 15 years ago.

The meeting adjourned at 8:20 pm.

Dear Ms. Mehlert,

At a regularly scheduled and properly noticed meeting¹ on December 11, 2025, Advisory Neighborhood Commission 6A voted 5-0-0 (with 4 Commissioners required for a quorum) to support the request submitted by Eric Konopka for development at 1378 C Street NE, BZA case number 21401. The applicant proposes to construct front and side additions, to an existing, semi-detached, two-story, principal dwelling unit in the RF-1 zone. Specifically, the applicant is requesting a Special Exception for relief from the roof top or upper floor element requirements of Subtitle E § 204.1, pursuant to Subtitle E § 204.4, Subtitle E § 5201, and Subtitle X § 901.2.

During the ANC 6A Economic Development and Zoning Committee meeting on November 19, 2025, Ms. Lacy Brittingham AIA, representing the applicant, presented a proposal for renovation of the property, which includes construction of two full-height bay projections and resulting alteration of rooftop cornice. The design has taken measures to ensure that the additions are in the character of the neighborhood and it will not disrupt the privacy, air and light of neighbors. The architect and owner have proven that the Special Exception criteria has been met through submission of architectural drawings and discussions with neighbors. The ANC believes that this development will align with the character, scale, and pattern of houses in the neighborhood.

Dear Director Kershbaum:

At a regularly scheduled and properly noticed meeting¹ on December 11, 2025, Advisory Neighborhood Commission 6A voted 5-0-0 (with 4 Commissioners required for a quorum) to send this letter urging DDOT to renew its focus on the 11th Street NE corridor from Florida Avenue to East Capitol Street. According to DDOT’s FY26 Q1 prioritization dashboard, the intersection of 11th and E Streets NE is under investigation for speed and traffic issues. Given this intersection’s proximity to School within School and the Sherwood Recreation Center, we encourage DDOT to coordinate with programs like Safe Routes to School to make this corridor safer for all users.

In February 2025, ANC 6A wrote to DDOT encouraging traffic calming action when the FY25 Q2 prioritization dashboard said part of this area is under investigation for speed issues (TSI 24-00515046 & 24-00277322/<https://anc6a.org/wp-content/uploads/TPS-FEB-2025-11th-St-NE-TSI.pdf>).

Concerns about this corridor have persisted for some time, including a June 2023 letter from ANC 6A (<https://anc6a.org/wp-content/uploads/ANC6A-Support-for-traffic-calming-11th-Street-NE.pdf>), detailing that residents have long requested vertical traffic calming and automated traffic enforcement to slow drivers. In response to this letter your agency replied (on July 7, 2023) that they planned to install 10 speed humps along the corridor. This promise was later rescinded for reasons the ANC does not fully understand. In the ensuing months there were several crashes, including one into a corner store at 11th and C Street NE. One resident has had three cars parked on the street totaled by dangerous drivers.

In October 2024, ANC 6A sent a letter to DDOT requesting an update on plans to make this corridor safer (<https://anc6a.org/wp-content/uploads/ANC-6A-support-for-traffic-calming-on-11th-Street-NE.pdf>). While the inclusion of the corner of 11th and F Streets NE in DDOT’s FY25 Q2 prioritization is a welcome step, we urge DDOT to reinstate the plan to install speed humps and raised crosswalks along the entire corridor which sees heavy and fast-moving traffic due to it feeding into I-695 in Southeast DC.

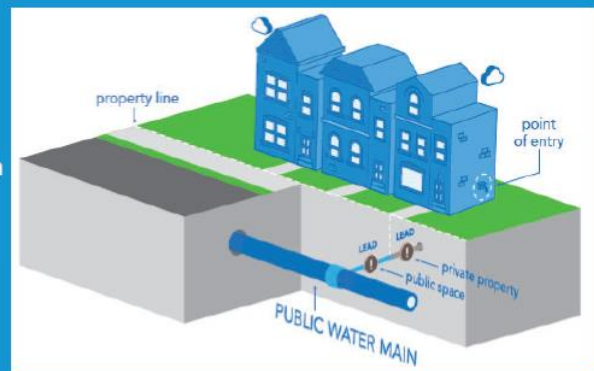
Health Effects of Lead in Drinking Water

- Lead is a powerful neurotoxin
- No safe level of lead
- Exposure to lead may cause:

 - Injuries to other soft tissues and organs

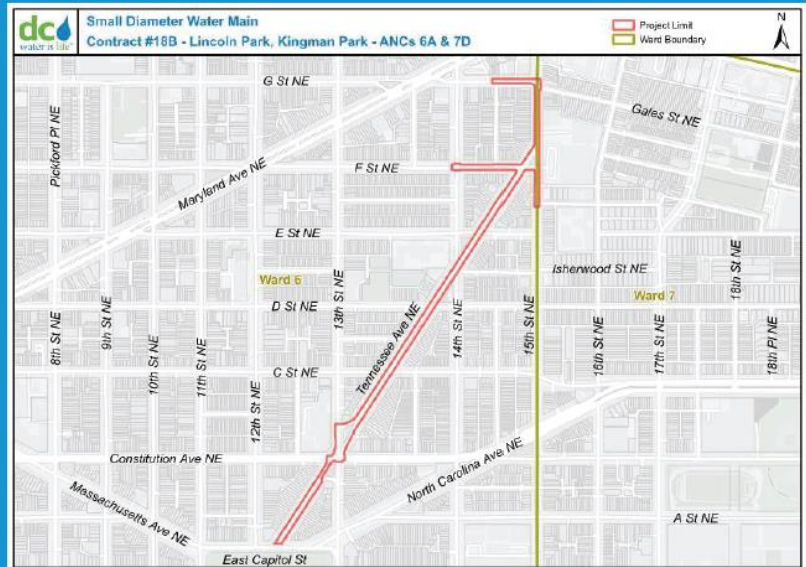

RIGHT OF ENTRY AUTHORIZATION TO REPLACE WATER PIPE ON MY PROPERTY FOR FREE

Please complete all required fields on the Authorization Form will not be accepted.

Lead in water from lead or lead-containing water pipes can be harmful to you and your family and/or residents. DC Water wants to replace lead water pipes because it is a step in lowering your and your family's and/or residents' risks of lead exposure, but we need your consent. This Right of Entry Authorization means you agree to allow DC Water and our Contractor to enter your private property to replace your lead water pipes with new copper water pipes for Free, at No Cost to you. This Authorization also means you agree to tell DC Water about any hidden hazards you know about on your private property that could prevent them from doing the work or warn the people replacing your pipes. Please Note: We also recommend you work with a licensed plumber to identify any other sources of lead pipes inside your building and consider removing them as well.

This is what DC Water's Contractor will do (See attached diagram):

1. Turn off the water service to your building for about eight (8) hours;
2. Dig down near the District water main, meter, and at property line and remove/abandon your lead water pipe from the water main in the street, through your building wall or floor, to the pipe connection in your building;
3. Install a new copper water pipe from the District water main in street to your building, through the wall where the pipe comes in and connected to the water pipe in your building; and
4. Turn on water, fill holes made, restore area, and flush water from the outside hose connection, if possible.

This is what you should expect:

1. Contractor will replace the lead water pipe with a copper water pipe at your private property at No Cost to you. The workers will enter your private property and your building to do the replacement. They will forego a lock to confirm the material of the water pipe near the property line. Once confirmed, they will follow the steps above, likely on a separate day. They will take photos and video before, during, and after installation.
2. Contractor will try to leave your private property as close to how it was found or better. Contractor may need to remove driveway, tiles, walls, fences, shrubs, sidewalks, driveways, stones, soil, flowers, plants or other permanent things on your property. Contractor will clean the exterior work areas and do temporary and permanent restoration, that may include, if impacted: installing access panels; repairing sheet rock, drywall, spackling, prime and finish painting to match the original color; and reworking and replacing existing tile and substrate. The Contractor will clean the exterior work areas and do temporary and permanent restoration, that may include, if impacted: replacing brick, concrete, granite or asphalt with, sidewalk, pavement, driveway and retaining wall areas and leveling, and seeding, sodding, and plant replacement. The permanent restoration work will be scheduled at a different time. Contractor will try to avoid trees, shrubs, living plants as best possible, but are not responsible for any harm to grass, plants, etc. during the replacement process. DC Water and the Contractor cannot and will not help you move items on your property.
3. DC Water may not perform this work if: (1) there are hidden hazards that prevent the workers from replacing the pipe; (2) someone else owns the property and the owner does not agree to sign this Authorization; (3) You or an authorized person do not allow the Contractor to enter your property on the scheduled date; or (4) You or an authorized person are not home at the scheduled time and time and fail to reschedule the work.
4. DC Water will provide a water pitcher that lasts 6 months to you or residents of your property to use after the replacement and instructions for you to follow for flushing your faucets to remove any lead particles.

Alcohol Beverage and Cannabis Committee (ABC)

Name Change

In its organizational meeting in January 2025, ANC 6A voted to adopt the name Alcoholic Beverage Cannabis (ABC) Committee for this committee, which advises the Commission on issues related to the DC Government's Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Administration (ABCA). Previously, the committee operated as the Alcoholic Beverage Licensing (ABL) Committee. While this name change occurred midway through FY 2025, this report will refer to this committee consistently by its current name, the ABC Committee.

Meetings and Attendance

During FY 2025, the ANC 6A ABC Committee held 6 regularly scheduled public meetings, generally on the fourth Tuesday of each month. All meetings were conducted virtually on Zoom, began at 7:00pm, were properly noticed, and were open to the public for comments and questions.

In FY 2025 ANC 6A ABC Committee Meetings took place in October 2024 as well as January, March, April, May, and June 2025.

Liquor and Cannabis License Applications

At each of its meetings, the ABC Committee has considered any new and/or renewal applications for alcoholic beverage or cannabis licenses from business establishments within ANC 6A. Representatives from the business are invited and usually have chosen to attend the ABL meetings to provide an overview of their business and answer questions from the Committee and from any interested community members in attendance.

The ABC Committee voted on and made the following recommendations to the ANC based on votes taken at its meetings from October 2024 through September 2025.

- In its October 2024 meeting, the Committee recommended that ANC 6A protest the application for a new Class C restaurant license with sidewalk café, alcohol carry out and delivery endorsements at Alero H Street at 1301 H Street NE (ABRA-130290) unless a settlement agreement is reached and that Mr. Lockett represent ANC 6A in negotiations. In the November 2024 full ANC meeting, the Commissioners added a friendly amendment to add Commissioner Dooling to represent ANC 6A in these negotiations. ANC 6A concurred with this recommendation 6-0 in November 2024's ANC meeting.
- In its October 2024 meeting, the committee recommended that ANC 6A protest the application for a new Class C restaurant license with sidewalk café, entertainment, and cover charge endorsement at DC Capitol Square Bar and Grill at H Street at 14021 H Street NE (ABRA-129985) unless a settlement agreement is reached and that Mr. Lockett represent ANC 6A in negotiations. The original application has a number in the address (it should be 1402 H Street, which does have sufficient outdoor seating space), and ABCA will be issuing a new agreement. ANC 6A concurred with this

recommendation 6-0 in November 2024's ANC meeting.

- After the committee's October 2024 meeting, ANC 6A signed a letter of support for Dirty Water, 816 H Street NE, who was seeking a substantial change to the Class C Tavern license from an interior capacity of 66 to 198, by unanimous consent in November 2024's ANC meeting.
- Since the ABC committee did not meet in December 2024, ANC 6A took the following actions in its January 2025 ANC meeting, each by a vote of 6-0:
 - ANC 6A protested the application for Substantial Changes to a Class C Tavern license at Henceforth DC (ABRA-129163) at 1335 H Street, NE unless a settlement agreement was reached.
 - ANC 6A protested the application for a new Class C Tavern at Ethio Vegan at 1362 H Street NE (ABRA-130713) unless a settlement agreement was reached.
 - ANC 6A protested the application for a Medical Cannabis Retailer license for Dreamy DC (ABRA-130754) at 1111 H Street NE unless a settlement agreement was reached.
 - ANC 6A ANC 6A protested the application for a Medical Cannabis Retailer license for Proper Exotic, LLC (ABRA-128697) at 13 8th Street NE unless a settlement agreement was reached.
- In its January 2025 meeting, the committee recommended that ANC 6A protest the application of Dreamy DC, 1111 H St NE, for a medical cannabis license with delivery endorsement unless a settlement agreement is reached and ABCA verifies that this application is in compliance with DC law regarding distance between establishments. ANC 6A concurred with this recommendation by unanimous consent in its February 2025 meeting.
- In its January 2025 meeting, the committee recommended that ANC 6A send a letter to the DC Council creating a provision for a moratorium zone for cannabis licenses equivalent to the provision for a moratorium zone for alcohol licenses. ANC 6A concurred with this recommendation by unanimous consent in its February 2025 meeting.
- In its January 2025 meeting, the committee recommended that ANC 6A recommended that ANC 6A protest the application of Dumpling Hot Pot Beyond, 1216-1218 H St NE, for a Class C Restaurant license with carry out and delivery endorsement unless a settlement agreement was reached. ANC 6A concurred with this recommendation by unanimous consent in its February 2025 meeting.
- In its January 2025 meeting, the committee recommended that ANC 6A protest the application of Tigo's, 1322 H St NE, for a Class C restaurant license unless a settlement agreement was reached. Ultimately, in its February 2025 ANC meeting, ANC 6A voted 5-0 to send a letter of support for a stipulated Class C restaurant license for this establishment.

 - ANC 6A send a letter to ABRA requesting clarification that the proposed location for Proper Exotic at 313 8th Street NE is not in violation of the proximate requirements of the specific nearby establishments that cater to children/minors.

- In ANC 6A's July 2025 meeting, the commission voted 7-0 to protest the renewal of an alcoholic beverage license with summer garden endorsement at Tiffany's Bar and Bistro at 709 H Street NE unless a settlement agreement is reached. If the establishment is in the renewal process, ANC 6A will protest unless a settlement agreement is reached; if there is already a valid license, ANC 6A will work with the establishment in good faith to reach a settlement agreement.

- In ANC 6A's July 2025 meeting, the commission voted 7-0 to protest of the application for a medical cannabis license at Proper Exotic, 313 8th Street NE.

Economic Development and Zoning (EDZ)

During Fiscal Year 2025, the ANC 6A Economic Development & Zoning (EDZ) Committee served as the Commission’s forum for reviewing land use, zoning, and development matters affecting neighborhoods within ANC 6A. The Committee considered residential additions, accessory dwelling units, mixed-use and commercial projects, potential zoning map changes, and requests for time extensions and modifications before the Board of Zoning Adjustment (BZA) and the Zoning Commission (ZC).

The EDZ Committee meetings provided a transparent venue for applicants and community members, and the Committee developed recommendations for ANC 6A action where appropriate. The table below summarizes the zoning and development issues considered during FY 2025, compiled from individual EDZ meeting agendas.

In FY 2025, ANC 6A05 Commissioner Dave Wethington and Committee Member Mike Cushman co-chaired meetings of the EDZ. FY 2025 ANC 6A EDZ Committee Meetings took place in calendar year 2025, in January, March, May, July, and September.

Florida Ave NE from 7th Street NE to the Starburst Intersection.

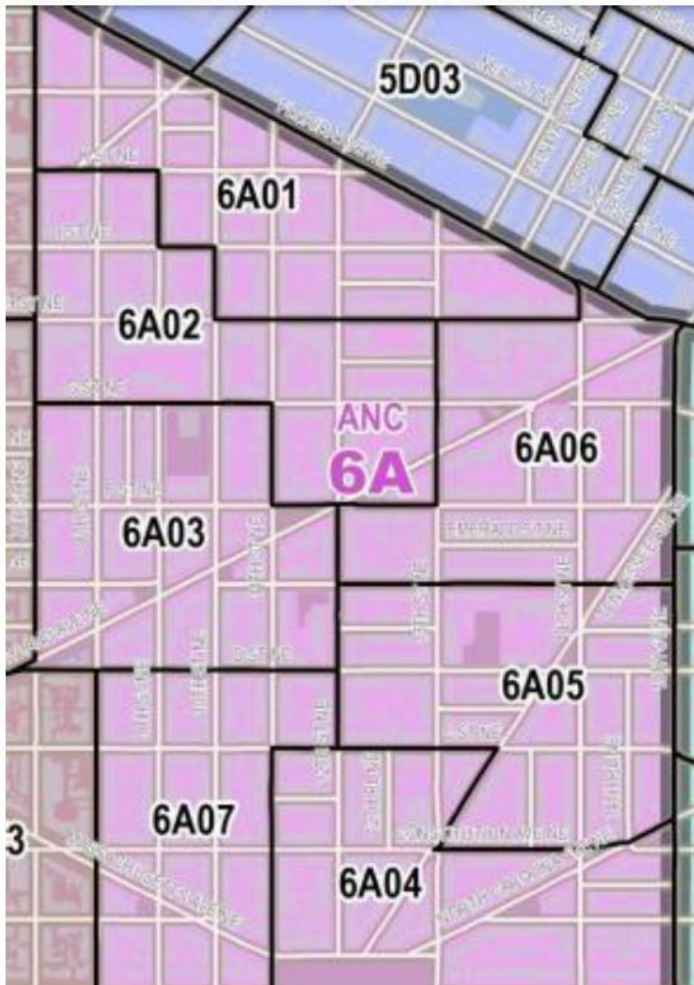
15th Street NE from the Starburst Intersection to East Capitol Street NE.
