## Call Box Update

The call box project is back on track. The Department of Public Works recently issued a second Request for Proposals to clean and stabilize the Call Boxes throughout the city. Bids were received from several interested contractors, and a contract will soon be awarded. Paul Williams, the city-wide organizer of the call box project is planning a workshop in January to meet the contractor, and discuss ideas for the boxes once they are cleaned. The January meeting will be a great way to network with various community groups working simultaneously.

## Street Cleaning Hiatus

The DC Department of Public Works will suspend mechanical street cleaning operations for ten weeks from January 4 until March 18, 2002. This is a regular suspension that occurs every year during the winter. During this time, the no parking/street cleaning restrictions will be lifted, and you will not be required to move your car on street-sweeping days during the sweeper hiatus. Other parking restrictions remain in effect, and will be enforced.

## 100 Days of Learning

February 1, Maury Elementary School will celebrate 100 Days of Learning with a day of reading and literacy based activities. Students will be entertained in their classrooms by "distinguished readers" who will share a favorite story or poem (or read a selection provided by the school). Children who have read 40 or more books will receive gift bags.
