Dear DDOT Traffic Safety Team,

As I have shared previously, on January 20, 2021, a driver came down I St NE, lost control of their car on the 700 block of I St NE and flipped their car. Both before and after that crash, a number of neighbors had approached me about dangerous driving, including speeding, rolling through stop signs and high speed uturns at intersections along I St NE, from perpendicular numbered streets.

I St NE is a one-way neighborhood street that is adjacent to H St NE, which has been a persistent site of crashes <u>including three crashes into storefronts</u>. I St NE is often used as a cut through by drivers, which is especially dangerous because we have an unprotected contra-flow bike lane on the street, children playing on sidewalks, and pedestrians using the sidewalks and bike lane for walking dogs, social distancing, and to walk to essential errands and jobs. It is an alarming place to have speeds so high, andso many drivers ignoring stop signs altogether.

This TSA is for the intersection of 8th and I St NE. Many thanks for your attention to this matter!
