## **Resolution to support Kingsman School Proposal**

Whereas, the Charter Schools Development Corporation (CSDC) intent and commitment to the neighbors is to rehabilitate and return to the community a safe, secure, modern charter school facility that will once again be an asset;

Whereas CSDC has pledged to keep the community informed on the renovation and construction activities at Kingsman School;

Whereas, the CSDC has identified the Options Public Charter School, a middle school, and the Sasha Bruce Public Charter School, a high school, as permanent co-tenants of the building. Both charter schools are currently located in Ward 6, have enrollments of less than 300 students each and employ the same Expeditionary Learning Outward Bound curriculum;

Whereas, the Kingsman will be the permanent home for these two small public charter schools that, individually, would not have been able to afford this opportunity;

Whereas, the CSDC must be able to close title on the property before March 15, 2003;

Whereas, the CSDC must be able to begin the renovation work no later than April 1, 2003;

Whereas, the City Council must approve a resolution to declare Kingsman a surplus building and sell the property to the CSDC;

Whereas, the resolution is currently under consideration of Committee on Government Operations;

Whereas, the Committee on Economic Development must approve the disposition;

Whereas, the resolution needs to be voted on in a March council meeting; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, that the ANC 6A fully supports the redevelopment of the Kingsman School as an educational facility for K-12 charter schools and strongly encourages that City Council approve the resolution to declare Kingsman a surplus building and sell the property to the CSDC in order to close title on March 15, 2003 and begin construction on April 1, 2003.
